Code of Conduct

At **Centre Stage Performing Arts**, we aim to create a safe, respectful, and inspiring environment where every student can learn, grow, and enjoy the art of dance. This Code of Conduct outlines the behaviour we expect from all students, parents, and staff to ensure a positive experience for everyone.

Respect and Behaviour: All students are expected to treat their teachers, classmates, and studio staff with kindness and respect. Disruptive, inappropriate, or disrespectful behaviour will not be tolerated. Bullying of any kind, verbal, physical, or online, is strictly prohibited.

Attendance and Punctuality: Students should arrive on time for classes, ready to dance. Regular attendance supports progress and helps maintain class flow. If a student must miss a class, we ask that parents inform the school in advance whenever possible.

Class Etiquette: Students should listen carefully to their teachers, follow instructions, and always try their best. Mobile phones must be switched off or set aside during class. Food, chewing gum, and drinks other than water are not permitted in the studio.

Dress Code and Presentation: Students should wear the correct dance uniform for their class, ensuring clothing is clean, safe, and appropriate for movement. Hair should be neatly secured according to class requirements. Jewellery should not be worn for safety reasons.

Safety and Responsibility: Students must follow all safety guidelines given by staff. Running, unsafe behaviour, or misuse of equipment is not allowed. Teachers may make safe, appropriate physical corrections to assist with technique, always in line with safeguarding standards.

Parental Conduct: Parents and guardians are expected to communicate respectfully with staff, support school policies, and ensure students are dropped off and collected promptly. Any concerns should be raised directly with the school in a polite and constructive manner.

Commitment to Learning: Students are encouraged to approach class with a positive attitude, willingness to try new things, and respect for the learning process. Effort, consistency, and teamwork are valued just as much as technical progress.

Social Media and Online Conduct: Students and parents should use social media responsibly when discussing the school. Negative, harmful, or inappropriate posts about students, parents, or staff are not acceptable. Photos or videos involving other students must not be shared without permission.

Disciplinary Measures: If a student repeatedly fails to follow the Code of Conduct, the school may take action such as issuing warnings, speaking with parents, or, in serious cases, removing the student from classes for the safety and wellbeing of the group.
